Sharing the Power of Learning

The Minnesota Literacy Council assists in recognizing and supporting your volunteers and learners in a variety of ways. They include:

- MLC Certificates for volunteers for who have tutored a significant number of hours. The certificates can be modified for any number of hours with the volunteer's name. - Awards Luncheon. Integrated into the annual <u>Sharing the Power conference</u> is a recognition event for literacy volunteers, students and practitioners statewide. MLC gives Service Awards to volunteers who have reached the 1000-hour (or more) milestone, Volunteer Leadership Awards to volunteers who have shown strong dedication and leadership in their program, Learner Awards to learners who have had a positive influence on their peers or others, and Community Partnership Awards to groups or organizations that have made a significant positive contribution to a literacy program.
- Tutor E-Newsletter is emailed to volunteers monthly. It highlights an outstanding volunteer each month as a "Literacy Leader." The <u>Tutor E-Newsletter</u> also includes upcoming events, useful resources, and information on trainings and volunteer openings.
